


Arkansas's New Law

Minimum-Age: 21 years old

Effective Date September 1, 2019



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Minimum Age Restrictions

Arkansas Law Summary



NEW MINIMUM-AGE Law effective September 1, 2019 is 21 years old.

21 years old is the minimum age for customers to purchase (or for anyone to sell, buy for, distribute samples of, or furnish) any tobacco products, vapor products, alternative nicotine products, or e-liquid products to any person under 21 years of age.

EXCEPTION #1:



For Active Duty military personnel, the minimum-age is 18 years old. An identification card issued by the Armed Forces of the United States shall be accepted as proof of age for this exception.

EXCEPTION #2: Any person who became 19 years old by December 31, 2019.

FDA Summary (Federal) You must follow t

You must follow the Arkansas's 21 year minimum-age since it is higher than FDA's 18 year minimum-age requirement.

Minimum Age to Ask for ID

Arkansas Law Summary No requirement, but you must follow FDA's requirement below.

FDA Summary (Federal)

You must **Check photo ID of everyone appearing under age 27** who attempts to purchase FDA regulated products and verify the customer is of legal age to purchase. This is an each-and-every time requirement (even if you know the person to be of legal are.) If you "carded" them yesterday, you must "card" them again today!

Decline a sale when the customer is underage, has no photo ID, the photo ID contains no date-of-birth or the photo ID has expired.





Age Restricted Products - Tobacco and Vapor

Arkansas Law Summary

Tobacco in any form, including e-cigarettes, vapor products, alternative nicotine products, e-liquid products, cigarette papers and herbal snuff.

Acceptable forms of ID

Arkansas Law Summary

A valid document issued by a governmental agency containing a description and/or a photograph of the person and bearing a date of birth including, without being limited to, a passport, U.S. Armed Forces military identification card, or driver's license.

NOTE the EXCEPTION: Active duty U.S. military personnel — 18 years old is the minimum age. An identification card issued by the Armed Forces of the United States is acceptable proof.



Unless otherwise required by state or local law, FDA recommends that retailers accept only governmentissued photographic identification with the bearer's date of birth. (e.g., State-issued driver's license or identification card, military identification card, passport or immigration card) for establishing a legal age to purchase FDA regulated products. The Photo ID is not acceptable if it has expired.


Post Signs Required by State Law

Arkansas Law Summary

A sign must be displayed in a conspicuous place indicating that the sale of Restricted Products, or purchase of, or possession of Restricted Products by a person under the age of 21 years of age is prohibited by law. Failure to post signs will subject retailer to fines.

Penalties and Fines

Arkansas Law Summary

An employee or owner who violates this provision will be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100 per violation (plus court costs).

A notice of alleged violation containing the date and time of the violation and information concerning the person who made the illegal sale shall be given to the retailer within 10 days of the alleged violation.

Retailers who have received a notice of an alleged violation from the Arkansas Tobacco Control Board shall be subject to either criminal or civil penalties or fines of up to \$250 for a first violation within 48 months of the notice, a fine of up to \$500 and suspension of license for up to two (2) days for the second violation within 48 months, a fine of up to

\$1,000 and suspension of license for up to seven (7) days for a third violation within 48 months, a fine of up to \$2,000 and suspension of license for up to 14 days for a fourth or subsequent violation within 48 months and a fine of up to \$2,000 and a possible license revocation for a fifth (5) violation within 48 months. The Arkansas Tobacco Control Board maintains a record of all permits and licenses issued, suspended, denied, or revoked in a form that identifies the licensees and the location of the licensed or permitted premises.

Any retailer, individual or corporation that is prosecuted for a criminal violation shall not be subject to additional civil prosecution under the same facts.

Retailers are required to have each employee read and sign a **Tobacco Server Awareness Form**. This form is to be kept on file, and available for inspection. Failure to comply will result in fines being issued to the permit holder for each employee who does not have a signed server awareness form on file.

FDA Summary (Federal)

FDA has a variety of enforcement tools to address retailers who violate Federal statutes or regulations, including civil money penalties, warning letters, seizures, injunctions, no-sale orders and/ or criminal prosecution. Retailers who violate the regulations may also be in violation of state law and subject to state penalties or other related orders.

Customers Who Are Now Underage Due to 21 Year Law

New "21" state laws* require retailers to refuse the sale of tobacco and vapor products to anyone under the age of 21. And it's quite possible that you, the retailer, will be the first one to inform your customers about this new law.

We Card training covers challenges like handling difficult situations including refusing an underage sale using the A-E-R-O method.

We recommend A-E-R-O when speaking with customers who are no longer the legal age to buy tobacco and vapor products.
